We will be back in the office on Monday 5th January 2026. Wishing you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year 2026.

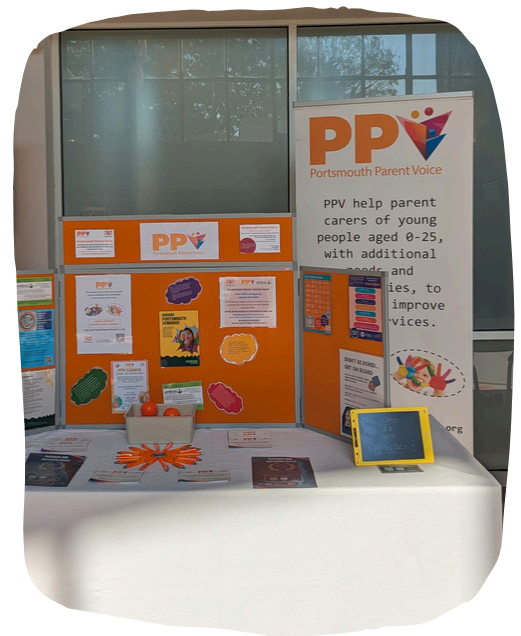

PROJECTS PPV HAVE BEEN WORKING

Annual Inclusion Conference

PPV attended the Portsmouth annual inclusion conference. This year the keynote speech was from Ginny Bootman, who has been a SENDCO for many years. She recently published a book 'Being A SENDCO'. PPV also attended two really useful workshops; one from the ND team about classroom resources and another from MHST a really insightful workshop on normalizing anxiety. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet and catch up with many of the cities school inclusion teams.



The Economist Interview

On October 2nd, PPV took part in an interview led by the Economist journalist Slavea Chankova all about the ND Profile Tool and PPVs part in the design and ongoing work.

Portsmouth SEND Appreciation Awards

Connors Toy Library won the Support for Families Award in recognition of their work lending over 10,000 toys to the community, helping children learn and develop through play.



Sarah Lehmkuehler, electoral services registration officer at Portsmouth City Council won the Co-production Award for her work in making voting accessible for young people with SEND. Co-production means listening to people's ideas and experiences, and making changes based on what they say.

Enable Ability won the Support for Young People Award. They help people with severe disabilities as well as those whose needs are at a milder to moderate level. The group support approximately 500 children and adults in Portsmouth.



Calm Kits

During the summer break PPV teamed up with MHST to host two Calm Kit sessions for families.

It was a fun, hands on experience where parent carers and their children created up to eight personalised items for their own calm kits . The session was designed to help with relaxation, focus and emotional regulation.

A big thank you to everyone who joined us and to the Mental Health Support Team for collaborating on such a creative and calming session.



Mystery shopper

PPV closed the sign-up to our Mystery Shopper project, which we are doing in collaboration with Hampshire and Southampton PCFs (Parent Carer Forums).

We have been working hard to contact families on a first sign-up basis and offer them a day out at a leisure or culture provider on us within Portsmouth. So far, families will be enjoying an annual Dockyard pass, the Panto and even the cinema.

All they need to do is complete a survey in return. The feedback survey will help improve families' access to their community's leisure and culture providers, providing an improved experience for families who have children and young people with SEN/Disabilities.

Send Faces

What is Send Faces?

SEND Faces is a peer led community organisation run by volunteers who provide emotional support, advocacy, activities for families and independent travel training. Although we are based in Portsmouth, our sessions are open to anyone in need of support, and we have families who join us regularly from Southampton. Our volunteers have a wealth of lived experience, but also have over 17 years of experience working within education, navigating relevant legislation and supporting people. Our volunteers also try to ensure they attend any relevant meetings to share feedback from the families they support, attend community events and regularly collaborate with other organisations to offer as much as they can.
